The region is home to over 300,000 people and is the center of a service area of over one million people throughout western Virginia. Botetourt, Craig, Franklin, and Roanoke counties and the cities of Roanoke and Salem are all part of this wonderful place to live, work and visit. The accolades include:

- Expansion Management magazine's named Roanoke as one of the 50 hot-test cities for expansions and relocations.
- Expansion Management also named the Roanoke Valley one of its Five-Star Communities for quality of life. The rating is based on a reasonable cost of living, affordable housing, low crime, excellent transportation access, good public schools, proximity to community colleges and universities, an educated work force, and low taxes.
- Roanoke was ranked the 11th best city in the U.S. by the publication, "Cities Ranked and Rated".
- Roanoke was ranked as one of the 100 best places for business development by Inc. Magazine.
- The U.S. Department of Education has recognized Roanoke Valley schools for being among the nation's best.
- Money Magazine ranked Roanoke as one of the top three "Best Places to Retire in the United States." The city was picked among the five best cities for retirees in a survey by Kiplinger.com.

## COST OF LIVING

The Roanoke Valley has a lower cost of living than the national average according to the ACCRA Cost of Living Index. The Valley's cost of living is 90.0, below the national average of 100. ACCRA compares groceries, housing, utilities, transportation, health care, and miscellaneous goods and services for 301 urban areas.

## DRIVER'S LICENSE/AUTO REGISTRATION

A Virginia driver's license is required after residence has been established. A person must be 16 years and three months of age to obtain a Virginia driver's license.

To license an automobile in Virginia, a valid title of ownership must be established with the state and proof of sales and use tax furnished. Vehicles must be inspected annually with the:

The counties of Botetourt, Craig, Franklin, and Roanoke each employ a county administrator and have an elected board of supervisors. Vinton is an incorporated town within Roanoke County. Roanoke and Salem are independent cities. Vinton, Roanoke, and Salem have the council-manager form of government, with a mayor serving as chair of the council. ### Virginia Individual Income Tax Rates:

Less than \$3,000 2% of federal adjusted gross income\*

\$3,001 - \$ 5,000: \$60 + 3% of excess over \$3,000

\$5,001 - \$17,000: \$120 + 5% of excess over \$5,000

More than \$17,001: \$720 + 5.75% of excess over \$17,000

\*With exemptions of \$800 each and applicable modifications.
